\$50,000 Community Fund:

A cheque has been received from Cargill Australia for \$50,000 and the funds are deposited in our NAB account awaiting invoices from Maribyrnong City Council.



Maribyrnong City Council:

Maribyrnong City Council distributed a newsletter to you last year regarding this project. They have advised that removal of trees will commence in early March with new plantings to be undertaken in May of this year.

Brooklyn Community Representative Group (BCRG) – Reports:

EPA Victoria: While odour has been significantly eliminated from our neighbourhood in 2011, we are still working with EPA to require industry to comply with their licence and not permit odour to go beyond their boundary.

Dust – PM 10 – This continues to be a major problem in the area and Councils, VicRoads and EPA continue to investigate ways and means to take action to improve the situation.
