

A transfer station and mulch processing area still operate at the site. Closure dates for Market Rd landfill is reviewed every six months. An aerial is used by a surveyor to determine the current contour level of the site and this is measured against the approved contour plan to determine the amount of airspace still available and the estimated closure date. These dates are estimates only, Transpacific has consistently said that these dates depend on future waste throughput at the site as well as the rate of settlement. The Market Rd landfill is 50 metres deep, hence there has been a lot of settlement in the past few years which means that filling has taken longer than expected. There has been no delay by Transpacific in filling the site. The Market Rd site is currently estimated to stop taking waste by the end of this financial year – June 2012.

The transfer station and mulch processing areas are still operational, an end date is not yet known. Transpacific has a licence to process mulch at the site, however the transfer station is not a scheduled activity and does not require an EPA licence. Market Rd landfill is expected to cease taking waste by June 2012 and following this, the site will be capped. It is not yet known what the long term intentions are for the site. Transpacific must manage ongoing environmental liabilities at both sites such as leachate and gas, even after they stop accepting waste and the area is capped. This requires ongoing rehabilitation works and infrastructure to be in place such as gas wells, flares, leachate dams and leachate sumps.

					A number of roads in the area, including Somerville road, Francis Street and Paramount Road are VicRoads managed roads. While VicRoads are responsible for the sweeping of their roads, Council has undertaken sweeping along some of them in this area to assist.
					Council's Operations Manager, Leon Berry is currently discussing with VicRoads a suitable treatment for the footpaths and nature strips along Somerville Road and we expect to have agreement on the treatment and funding for implementation in early 2013. Further improvement works be undertaken in other roads which will be staged to match available funding.
					It is apparent that a contributing factor of the soil build up on the footpaths is the standard of abutting site surfaces and operational activities performed on these sites. Much of the soil has washed off the various industrial sites onto the road reserve and to achieve long term solutions to the problem, this issue will need to be addressed.
