1) Metropolitan Planning Strategy Community consultation in March

25/02/13 The following information was supplied by Jen Lilburn, Convenor, BCRG.

The Victorian Government is preparing a new Metropolitan Planning Strategy for Melbourne to build on its liveability and ensure the future prosperity of the State.

The strategy will contribute to the overall vision for the State including links with regional Victoria. It will shape how the city changes, which areas will house more people and which planning rules should change to facilitate new and more diverse housing.

The strategy will be developed through extensive community engagement. It will be informed by rigorous research and evaluation into future trends, the drivers of growth and change and the type of infrastructure and services required in the future.

Community members are encouraged to contribute to the development of the plan through a variety of ways including:

- a major community forum this Saturday 2 March
- 'community conversations' which can be held in local communities (On The Nose, BRAG and Friends of Lower Kororoit Creek have all been encouraged to take up this offer)
- an online forum and survey
- written submissions

20/02/13 Ray Martin, provided the following response: 'Only the owners of the properties who have been asked to pay the special charges have the right to appeal to VCAT about Council's decision to impose special charges.

Having said that, the plight of the residents is now well documented and this will no doubt be discussed at VCAT.'
