1) Cargill June update on odour control

2) Brooklyn Stockpile Working Group - Call for Nominations extension

Background: At the May 14 BCRG Community Forum, Brimbank City Council staff led a discussion related to the management of the stockpiles in Brooklyn.

The purpose of the group would be to craft a letter outlining the issues such as the gap in planning regulations in relation to their management of the stockpiles and asking the councils to address these with the relevant Ministers.
