<b>2905_3:</b> <i>BCC to respond to the question: Is the Statewide waste implementation plan compatible with the Brooklyn Evolution Strategy?</i>	Dust	Simon Vittorio, Brimbank CC	29/05/19	COMPLETE	<p>21/10/19 Simon Vittorio sent this response form the BCC City Strategy Department.</p> <p><i>The Brooklyn Evolution Strategy 2012 (Brooklyn Evolution) recognises that the Brooklyn Industrial Precinct (the Precinct) is located within the Western State Significant Industrial Precinct. It contains broad land use, employment and economic objectives that include (but is not limited to) improving the overall amenity of the Precinct by reducing the impact of existing land use on surrounding residential; maintaining and strengthening the Precinct's economic roles; creating a dynamic and attractive work environment; and providing an environment that supports sustainable industrial activities.</i></p> <p><i>The State Wide Waste and Resource Recovery Instructure Plan 2018 (SWWRIP) identifies the Precinct as a hub of state significance with a focus on its role in undertaking waste and or resource recovery activities which are important at the state level. Both the Brooklyn Evolution and the SWWRIP recognise the need to address the amenity impacts on surrounding communities.</i></p> <p><i>The Brooklyn Evolution is more focussed on the transition of uses over time to a potential combination of light industry, general manufacturing, modern factory estates, warehousing, storage, and commercial uses such as restricted retail where appropriate. It also includes that existing industrial uses should be encouraged to invest and upgrade facilities to meet current best practice technology; and that new industry should be required to demonstrate incorporation of best practice technology into proposed development. It highlights the opportunity for existing landfill sites to be converted into other uses at the end of their lifecycle. On this basis the Brooklyn Evolution is broader than the SWWRIP and is not considered to be incompatible with the SWWRIP.</i></p>
